Oklahoma aerospace summit set for June

American Airlines Executive Vice President Bob Reding will be the keynote speaker at the eighth annual Oklahoma Aerospace Alliance Summit & Expo on June 15-18 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, 100 W. Second St., in downtown Tulsa.

Reding will provide a global industry outlook, including how the current financial crisis is affecting Oklahoma's aerospace industry, and a look at future implications of the crisis.

The three-day summit will also feature a variety of regional and national speakers on unmanned aerial systems and their anticipated impact on the aerospace industry.

The summit and expo will showcase products, services and capabilities for aerospace companies, education and training organizations, and nonaerospace companies that want to do business with Oklahoma's aerospace indus-

try. More than 100 exhibitors are expected.

Sessions will include multi-resource funding, exploring liquidity alternatives and nontraditional funding sources, an industry matchmaking session that enables business discussions with potential aerospace buyers such as American Airlines, NOR-DAM, Lufthansa, FAA, Flight Safety, L-3 Communications/Aeromet, Spirit Aerosystems, Boeing and Tinker AFB.

Other topics will focus on innovative solutions for managing suppliers and integrators while trimming cost and improving system availability, and tactics for coping with shortages of skilled labor and qualified mechanics.

The summit will conclude with the Aerospace Education and Training Day at Tulsa Technology Center's Riverside campus, 801 E. 91st St.
